INTRODUCTION

The Eltham Wildcats Basketball Club had humble beginnings from basketball activities within Eltham High School. After a series of informal games against various schools, the first two teams were entered into an organised competition, the Presbyterian Men's Basketball Association in the Winter season of 1965.

From these beginnings, the Club, as of 2019, has developed and grown to now cater for 5,800 players, both male and female of all ages. It has a turnover of \$2.2m and a team of paid employees working out of our offices at Eltham High School. This team is underpinned by a large group of casual employees and dedicated volunteers. We provide pathways for players, coaches, technical officials and administrators starting with our extensive range of beginner programs, our junior domestic Wildcat teams (playing in the EDJBA), our junior championship teams (playing in the VJBL) and our local adult competitions held Monday-Thursday nights.


At an elite level, the club has men's and women's team playing in the Youth (U23) competitions run by Basketball Victoria's 'Big V'. In 2018, the Eltham Wildcats were accepted as a foundation member of the inaugural NBL1 competition, the premier winter competition in Australia and supported by the National Basketball League.

The Club exists to serve the surrounding community through the provision of opportunities for recreation, enjoyment and the pursuit of excellence, for all those who wish to participate, irrespective of age, gender or ability. For these reasons, the Club runs a diverse programme to cater for the variety of interests of the members of the community.

We've hosted our annual January basketball tournament for over 40 years, in conjunction with Dandenong Basketball Association since 1996. It is the largest junior basketball tournament in the world with participants from all over Australia and New Zealand. In recent times, we've seen teams compete from the USA, China and Singapore. In addition, for the past 9 years, we have run an All Abilities competition alongside the mainstream competitions. The 2019 event had 13,714 players playing for 1,431 teams.

This Strategic Plan has been developed to ensure that the Club continues to grow as a predominantly volunteer based organisation but acknowledges that the Club also needs to run as a successful business in a competitive environment.




PURPOSE

The Club will clearly define and align pathways for all participants to enter and develop to the level of their ability, including:

- Learn to play (introductory programs);
- Competitions, programs and activities;
- Inclusion;
- High performance.

- A greater awareness and knowledge of child abuse, child protection and our child safety commitment throughout the club. There is knowledge and confidence within the club to take appropriate action when there is concern for the safety of a child.
- Continued sense of achievement and enjoyment for all our players at all levels from Kinder Club to Elite squads.
- Efficient operations driven by a combination of full-time staff, part-time staff and volunteers utilising up to date technology where appropriate.
- Excellent communication to all our stakeholders.
- Improved retention of our quality full-time staff, part-time staff and volunteers with effective succession plans in place.
- Increased and improved facilities for the Club.
- More people involved in the Club as players, participants, officials and volunteers with all being provided opportunities, development and pathways.
- Strong financial results, so we can continue to invest in our Club whilst keeping fees at an affordable level.
- Superior internal reporting with the appropriate levels of governance firmly in place.
