Neville began his involvement with the Club in the second half of the 1970s as his three daughters, Peta, Katrina and Nadja, were playing. He was a qualified referee in an era where there were few adult referees. Neville took a leading role in developing referees until Gerry Carstairs was appointed. In 1981 he won the President's referees award. Less well known is his contribution to coaching where he assisted both girls' and boys' programs. He was one of the first coaches to provide written feedback on games to his teams. He also ran several clinics.
